### Needs

The low availability and mobilization of water resources limits access to drinking water and sanitation. It hinders the development of agricultural and economic activities in general. The annual production of drinking water is only 15 million cubic meters, while demand is estimated at about 30 million. Despite progress in recent years in access to drinking water, a significant portion of the population remains uncovered and at risk of recurrent drought in the country(as a result of the current drought, the majority of the traditional surface and sub-surface water sources dried up while the water table level sank drastically).

Key figures:

- 25 %( 206,000 person) of the whole population of the country are in need to increase their access to safe water, proper sanitation and improve their hygienic practices.
- 19,834 refugees are in need to increase their access to safe water, proper sanitation and improve their hygienic practices
- 49% of the rural population(around 118,000) person) do not have access to protected water sources
- Only 10% of the rural population has access to improved family latrines

### Activities or outputs

1) 23,000 women, girls, boys and men (including 10,000 pupils) have increased equal and sustained access to safe and appropriate water.

- Baseline assessment/KAP survey
- Construction of 20 new hand dug wells
- Rehabilitation of 6 water points(BH, HDW, Recervoir)
- Construction/Rehabilitation of 20 water and sanitation facilities at schools/Health centers
- Water quality analysis
- Distribution of spare part and tool kits

2) 12,280 women, girls, boys and men(including 5,000 pupils) have increased their access to appropriate and gender –

sensitive sanitation facilities

- Baseline assessment/KAP survey
- Construction/Rehabilitation of 20 water and sanitation facilities at schools
- Construction of 400 family latrines equipped with hand washing facility
- Distribution of 20 sanitation school kits
- Distribution of 40 cleaning kits for conducting cleaning campaigns,
- Organize cleaning campaigns in 40 localities

3) 37,200 women, girls, boys and men in the target communities and key institution have improved their hygienic practices and enhanced their capacity for sustainable WaSH interventions

- Baseline assessment/KAP survey
- Organize 200 hygiene promotion sessions (40 localities)
- Distribution of 6,000 hygiene kits
- Train women and men in communities and community – based organizations in the management of water and sanitation facilities including the operation and maintenance in a sustainable manner
- Training of 40 Hygiene promotors, Male and female

### Indicators and targets

Indicator 1.1 : Target population have increased their knowledge about preventive measures against waterborne diseases

Target Value : 37,200 women, girls, boys and men

Indicateur 1.2 : Target population who received kits store water safely in distributed containers and have soap and water available at a hand washing station
